



# Regulations and Policy

#### Petroleum Fund regulations established

- Collection of enrollment fee \$100 per tank system, annually
- Collection of a \$0.0075 fee per gallon on petroleum products imported/refined in the state
- Carry forward balance of \$7.5 million
- Coverage conditions

#### Board to Review Claims oversight


- Policies approved by the Board to correct program deficiencies
- Periodic review/revisions to cost guidelines (stay up to date with inflation, per diem rates, maintain consistency in claim submittals)


#### The Board consists of:

- The State Fire Marshal
- A representative of refiners of petroleum
- A representative of independent dealers in petroleum
- A representative of independent retailers of petroleum

# Enrollment (Registering Tanks)

Online database provides access to storage tank operators, Fund staff, and UST compliance staff

- Enrollment invoices and certificates
- Payment receipts
- Storage tank system information

Enrollment requires demonstration of system tightness

 Rely on UST compliance staff for interpretation of release detection records and third party tightness test results

Special circumstances brought to the Board

Board meeting attendance by Fund staff, environmental managers, operators, and case officers

# Not-To-Exceed-Proposals

Formatted and guided by the Cost Guidelines, established by Board Policy Resolution

Discussions have lead to improvements of the Cost Guidelines document

Work group meetings to ensure consistency in approvals

Ensure that work performed and paid for is approved by case officer

### Bids & Waivers

Policy Resolution in 2015 to define bid procedures

Bids are required for subcontractor costs exceeding \$6,000

Exceptions include soil disposal and laboratory fees

Bids over \$25,000 are approved by the case officers prior to work/purchase

Contentious or special circumstances are discussed across programs

Waivers are permitted, but must be approved by the case officer

Requires justification

# Payment

When it is time to request reimbursement for work performed, claims are submitted electronically

NTEP, approved equipment, waivers (if any) available at time of claim review

Case officer has opportunity to review claim prior to approval

Fund approval notifications sent to all parties

# Grant Program

New program in Nevada to help small businesses meet the October 2018 upgrade requirements

Statutes and Regulations written in partnership with UST compliance branch

UST inspectors handing out flyer during inspections

Certified individuals provided information electronically

Leaking UST program also referring operators to the grant program with sites that have active UST systems

## Realized Benefits

Cost control and validation

Transparency of site work

Interactive database system encompassing all programs' information

Promotes robust policy
