Ohio's Abandoned Gas Station Program

A Cooperative Initiative







- Utilizes funding from Clean Ohio Program
- Turns property into developable land and a community asset
- Coordinates with Ohio EPA, and the Bureau of Underground Storage Tank Regulations (BUSTR)



- Eligibility
 - BUSTR Class C site with documented petroleum release
 - Local governments (or jointly with private landowner)
 - No Responsible Parties



- Property Assessment Activities Up to \$100,000 for assessment activities, including Closure Assessments, BUSTR Tier I/II, VAP Phase I and II Property Assessments
- Cleanup & Remediation Activities Up to \$500,000 for cleanup activities, include tank pulls, soil and groundwater remediation, cleanup of non-petroleum contaminants, such as asbestos, lead paint, etc., and demolition

Overcoming barriers

- Not currently Class C
- VAP Phase I Assessments
- Foreclosure uncertainty
- Orphan tanks/undocumented contamination and landbanks

Project Profile: City of Cleveland

- Property owned by a local Community
 Development
 Corporation
- City paid for tank removal, state grant covered Tier 1 Source Investigation
- State Investment: \$25,736



Project Profile: City of Cleveland

- Combined gas station property with adjacent parcels
- Dollar Tree store employing 30-40 people from the local community




Project Profile: City of Sandusky

- Property transferred to the Erie County Land Bank via tax foreclosure
- Seven USTs removed, building and canopy demolished
- State Investment: \$199,367



Project Profile: City of Sandusky

- Sold properties for \$375,000
- \$1.5-\$2 million commercial redevelopment
- Property tax projections: \$24,500 annually
- Income tax projections: \$6,250-\$12,500 annually





Project Profile: City of Bexley

- Property owned by a developer
- Contamination has migrated off-site into a residential neighborhood
- State Investment: ~\$400,000



Project Profile: City of Bexley

- Will be renovated for a yoga studio and event space
- \$100,000 in improvements to building
- Will employ up to 12 staff and instructors
