Agency Mission


To provide an effective and efficient government funding model to support owners and operators in meeting financial responsibility and environmental cleanup requirements for petroleum underground storage tanks.





Commercial Reinsurance Program

Eligibility

- Owner/operator whose tanks meet EPA technical requirements
- Registered with ECY
- Can include a pre-existing leak

Claim

- Insured contacts insurer
- Insurer makes determination
- PLIA reimburses costs over \$75k






Loan and Grant Program Flow





Preliminary Planning Assessment (PPA)

- Up to \$150,000
- PLIA-assigned consultant gathers information
- 40 within 6 months
- 1 NFA; 4 insurance claims






Accomplishments

2016-2017 Award Cycle

5 financial offers made

Accomplishments 2018-2019 Award Cycle

- Applications received: 12
- Intake meetings held: 10
- Signed Statement of Work: 6
- PPAs anticipated to begin Fall 2018



Petroleum Technical Assistance Program (PTAP)

- RCW 70.149.040 (9)
- Petroleum storage tank systems
- MTCA (173-340 WAC)
- \$7,500 one-time fee





PTAP Eligibility

- Sites with a hazard ranking of 3, 4 or 5, or qualifying sites ranked 1 or 2¹.
- PLIA funded through the Loan and Grant or Reinsurance programs.
- NO impact to sediment or surface water.

- Sites with a hazard ranking of 1 or 2¹, or within the bounds of certain larger cleanup sites².
- Department of Ecology funded, for example, through Remedial Action Grant.
- Sites with co-mingled, non-petroleum contaminants.
- Sites in litigation³.



Exclusionary factors may be overridden by PLIA and Ecology based on the results of a site characterization



Sites with a 1 or 2 Hazard Ranking are eligible for PTAP if there is no surface water or sediment pathway. Sites that are located within or impact a Superfund Site, Nuclear Managed Site, Industrial Section Site or Dangerous Waste Site managed by the Hazardous Waste Toxics Reduction Program. Sites that are located within or impact a Superfund Site, Nuclear Managed Site, Industrial Section Site or Dangerous Waste Site managed by the Hazardous Waste Toxics Reduction Program.

Litigation may include potentially liable person (PLP), site, court supervision, agreed order or active contracts between Ecology and PLP.³

PLIA's goal is to provide written opinions within 45 days of receiving requests



NFA = No Further Action FA = Further Action PS = Partial Sufficiency






