## Mon. Sept. 18 – What is a septic system? (And how to know if you have one)



### **Post Copy:**


A septic tank is an at-home #wastewater treatment container that receives ALL the water that is used in your home. That's right, it takes in water from your shower , dishwasher, laundry, sink, and even the toilet ! After entering the tank, the water is treated and released into your yard's drainage field. Across Montana, approximately 40-50% of homes have septic tanks. One way to determine if your home has a septic system is to check your property records.

Septic FAQs: We've got answers! #SepticSmartWeek

- 1. Where does the water from the septic tank go?
- A: After your home's wastewater is treated in the septic tank it is released to an area in your yard called the drainage field.
- 2. Why should I maintain my septic system?
- A: Maintaining your septic tank helps you save money and helps keep our Montana waters clean!
- 3. How often should I have my tank examined?
- A: For the average home, inspect the septic tank every 3-5 years and pump as necessary during this time period.
- 4. How do I take care of my septic system?
- A: Best practices include conserving your water use, flushing responsibly, and getting your tank inspected and pumped every 3-5 years. (Stay tuned for more tips!)
- 5. Who should I contact about my septic tank?

# Thurs. Sept. 21- Bathroom/laundry tips for a healthy septic system




## **Post Copy:**

When it comes to the bathroom and laundry, dollets are not trashcans! Don't flush diapers, wipes, or dental floss as they can damage your septic system. As for washing machines, wash full loads and stagger the use of appliances that use water to avoid a backup or overwhelming your septic system. #SepticSmartWeek



Fri. Sept. 22- Drainfield tips for a healthy septic system



### **Post Copy:**

Keep your drainfield – the area in your yard where wastewater is released from the septic tank into the ground– in tip-top shape! Avoid compacting the soil which can damage drainfield pipes by keeping it clear from vehicles and livestock , trees and shrubs, and excess rainwater that can slow down the wastewater treatment process. #SepticSmartWeek
