Stay Updated on Regulations

Federal, state, and local regulations

Maintain Accurate Records

Submit timely reports

Preventive Maintenance

- Routine inspections
- Inspect spill and overfill prevention systems regularly

PROACTIVE COMPLIANCE

Stay updated on regulations

- Federal regulations
- State regulations
- Local regulations

Maintain accurate records

- Ensure all records are up-to-date
- Regularly review and update records

Submit timely reports

- Adhere to reporting deadlines
- Proactively review report accuracy in advance

PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE

Routine Inspections

- Conduct regular checks
- Ensure UST system integrity

System Integrity Testing

- Schedule and perform tests
- Identify potential issues early

Spill and Overfill Prevention Systems

- Install prevention systems
- Test systems regularly

LIFECYCLE ANALYSIS

- What Is Lifecycle Analysis? A proactive, full-picture approach to identifying and managing environmental risks and costs from acquisition, management and divestment.
- Why It Matters for Owners:
 - Reduce Surprise Costs: Identify hidden liabilities before they become expensive problems.
 - Improve ROI: Align environmental investments with long-term business goals.
 - Strengthen Negotiations: Be informed and confident during acquisitions, redevelopments, or divestments.
 - Stay Compliant, Stay Operational: Avoid costly shutdowns or penalties.
 - Preserve Exit Value: Clean, documented environmental records protect asset value at sale.

CLEAR COMMUNICATION

Provide Accessible Guidelines

- Offer clear and understandable guidelines
- Ensure guidelines are easily accessible to all stakeholders

Training Resources

- Develop comprehensive training materials
- Make training resources available online

Regulatory Updates

- Keep stakeholders informed of regulatory changes
- Provide timely updates on new regulations

Workshops and Webinars

- Organize educational workshops
- Host webinars to reach a wider audience

SUPPORTIVE PARTNERSHIPS

Engaging UST Owners and Consultants

- Host regular coordination meetings
- Establish clear and responsive feedback loops

Sharing Compliance Tools and Best Practices

- Co-develop tools, templates, and guidance documents with stakeholders
- Offer technical assistance on evolving standards and best practices
- Actively participate in national conferences and regulatory discussions

EFFECTIVE ENFORCEMENT

Tiered Enforcement Strategies

- Apply proportionate enforcement actions based on the severity and frequency of non-compliance
- •Use informal notices, compliance schedules, or formal penalties depending on risk and repeat violations

Follow-Up and Resolution

- Conduct timely follow-up inspections or documentation reviews
- Confirm corrective actions are completed and compliance is fully restored

INNOVATION & EVOLVE

Targeted Risk-Based Support

- •Focus enforcement and support on high-risk systems based on type, materials, location, age and historical performance
- Utilize GIS and data analytics tools to monitor compliance and identify emerging risks

Modernize Infrastructure for Safety and Efficiency

- •Promote enhanced containment systems, such as double-walled tanks with interstitial monitoring and secondary containment for piping
- •Encourage adoption of automated tank gauging (ATG) and real-time leak detection systems to improve early warning and reduce release impact

Common Threads

- Robust Operator <u>Training</u> Programs
- Strong Financial Assurance Mechanisms
- Consistent Walk-Through Inspections
- Proactive Inspection and Data Tracking

Strategic Pillars

- Proactive Education
 - Advance notification, assistance before inspections and emphasis on meaningful owner/operator training
- Supportive Partnerships
 - Close collaboration with UST owners and consultants with ongoing feedback loops.
- Rigorous Tracking Systems
 - Digital reminders and test tracking for compliance events. Fast escalation when deadlines are missed.



BEST IN CLASS UST CLOSURE: LOUISIANA'S RECAP PROGRAM

How Louisiana Stands Out in UST Closure

- RECAP (Risk Evaluation/Corrective Action Program) tailors UST site investigations and remediation to each location's contamination profile, land use, and risk level.
- Defined Risk-Based Standards: Minimum remediation objectives are clearly defined under RECAP, ensuring consistent and protective outcomes.

Key Features of Louisiana's RECAP Approach:

- **Tiered Remediation Options**: Offers a structured choice between multiple options—from initial screening to extensive corrective actions (Management Options 1–3).
- Site Ranking & Exposure-Based Evaluation: Prioritizes and tailors actions through detailed site ranking and investigation criteria.
- Guidance & Experience: Assessment and Remediation activities follow established LDEQ UST guidance, continually enhanced by regulators, UST owners and consultants.
